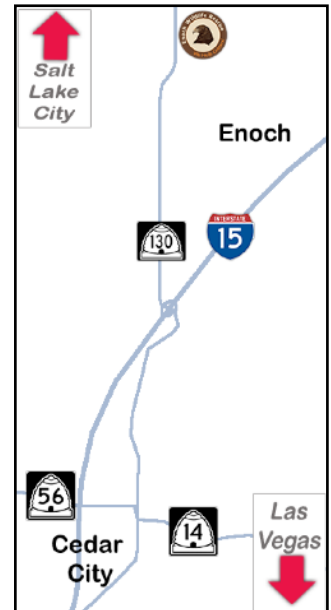
The back of the property (west side) borders the Minersville highway, but **there is no access from the highway.**

From Las Vegas:

- Highway 15
- Exit 62 130 North Main
- Left onto 130 North Main Street towards Enoch

From Salt Lake City:

- Highway 15
- Exit 62 130 North Main
- Right onto 130 North Main Street towards Enoch



Detail Directions from Highway 15

- Go north on the Minersville Highway (UT-130)
- Continue heading north through the roundabout on the Midvalley Road intersection.
- Turn right on 5600 North (heading east) go 2 blocks.
- Turn left on 700 East (heading north) also known as Bark Avenue
- Continue heading north until you reach the Enoch Dog Park
- Turn left at the sign for Enoch Dog Park and you will see our new rescue facility directly to the West at the end of the block
- We are west of the dog park and south of the Enoch Animal Shelter.
